WARWICK CASTLE

Warwick Castle is a place for all the family especially for children. This historic castle holds many fun events and walks ,from watching knights fighting to exploring the grounds. Warwick Castle is 109 miles away from school but it is worth the journey!

This castle was built in the 11th century and was originally a wooden 'motte' and 'baily' (built in 1068), then later rebuilt with stone (1260). It was one of the earls (Henry De Beauchamp later the Duke of Warwick) of Warwick that supervised the Joan of Ark's trial and also chose her punishment. One of its owners in 1628 was beheaded by his manservant and is told that goes around the castle looking for his head. This place is full of history and is waiting for you...

This place is a one of a kind experience and is highly recommended.

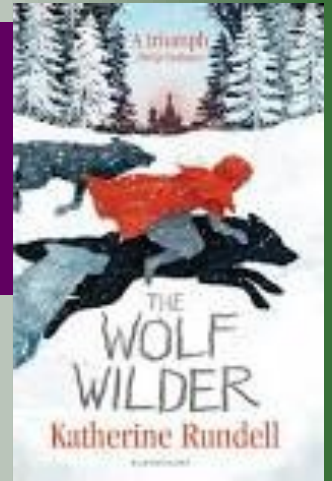
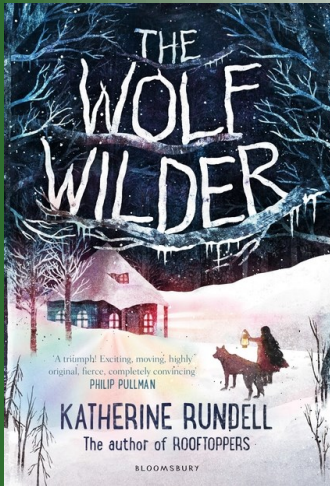

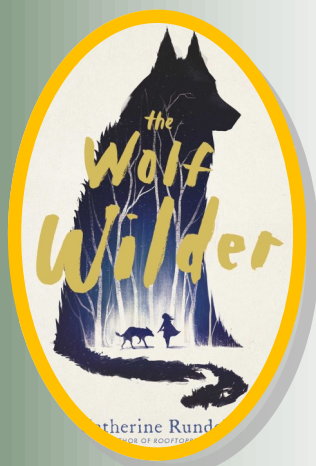


The Wolf Wilder by Katherine Rundell

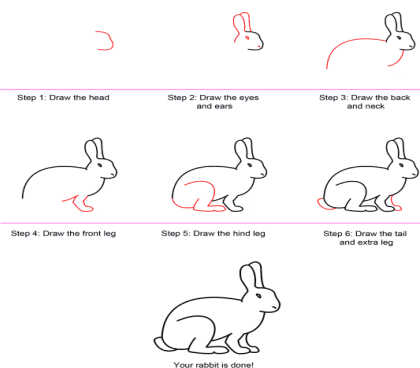
RABBITS

As it's nearly Easter, we've chosen Rabbits as our animal!

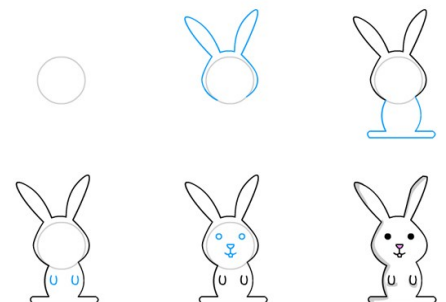
Here are 7 amazing, fun facts about **RABBITS**

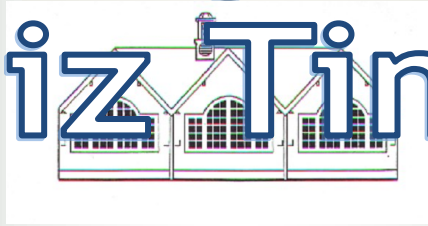
