

Preston Manor

This week year 5 visited Preston Manor and Hove museum for an immersive experience linked to their Victorian topic. They spent half of the day applying for and experiencing jobs that Victorian children would have spent their time doing. The other half of the day was spent at Hove museum exploring primary Victorian artefacts and trying to work out whether they were used for cooking, cleaning, lighting or were in fact a mystery object! We learnt a lot about just how different Victorian life was from our own and how hard it must have been to be a Victorian child.

On Thursday, Year 3 became historians as they studied torn sections of the Ancient Egyptian Book of the Dead, decoded hieroglyphs, examined artefacts from pharaoh's tombs and to top it all, saw a real mummy! During our visit to Haslemere Museum, the children were an absolute credit to the school with their lovely manners and impeccable behaviour. We were so proud of them! The day was rounded off with a super festive sing-along on the coach home which bodes well for our carol concert on the 16th!

Project POW (Protect Our Wildlife)

Last Monday, Year 6 had their evening of presentations and speeches. They invited their parents to come and see the work they have been doing to help support the work of the animal charity, Born Free. After a visit from David Bolton at Born Free, Year 6 felt inspired to support an endangered animal.
