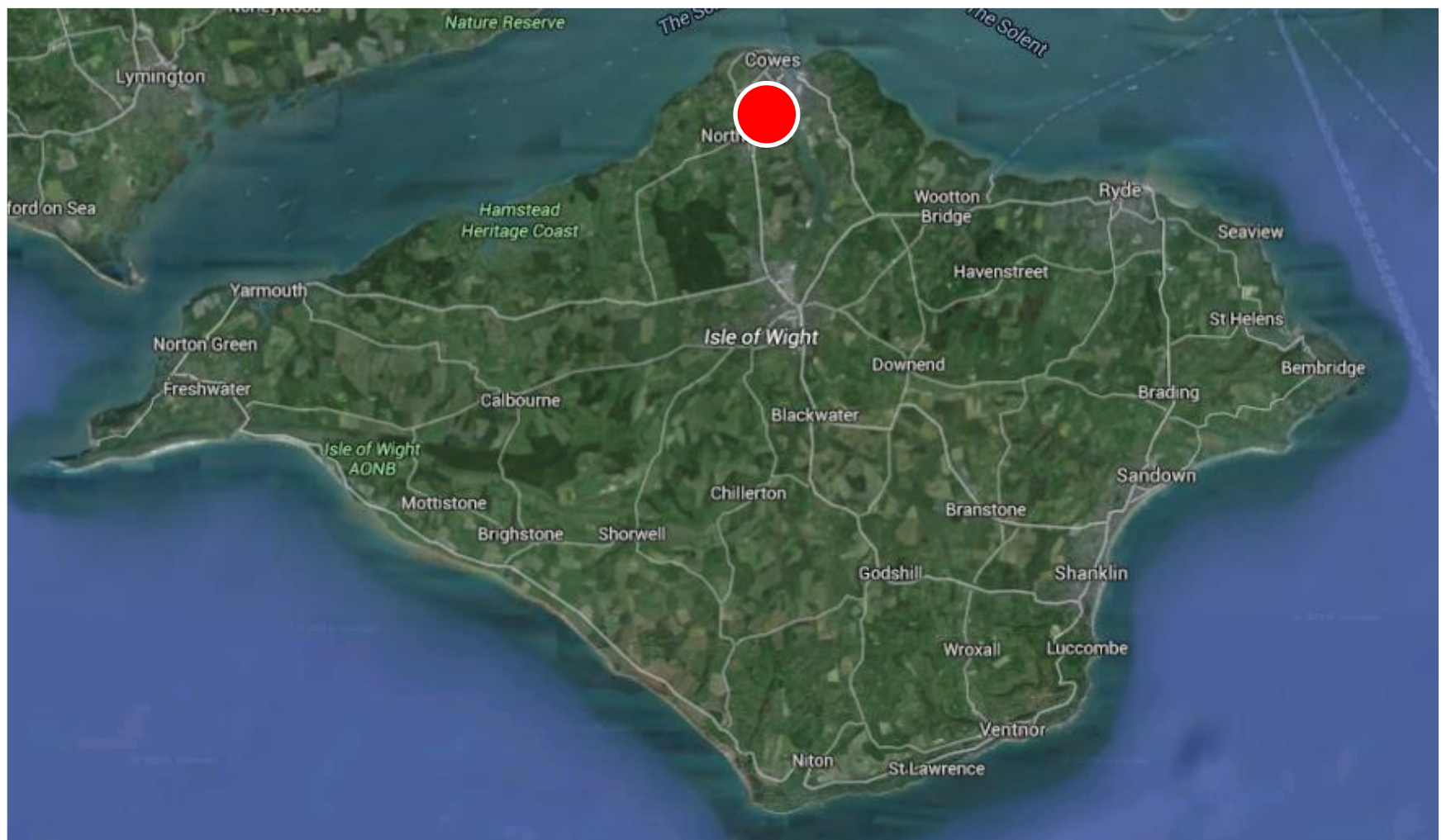

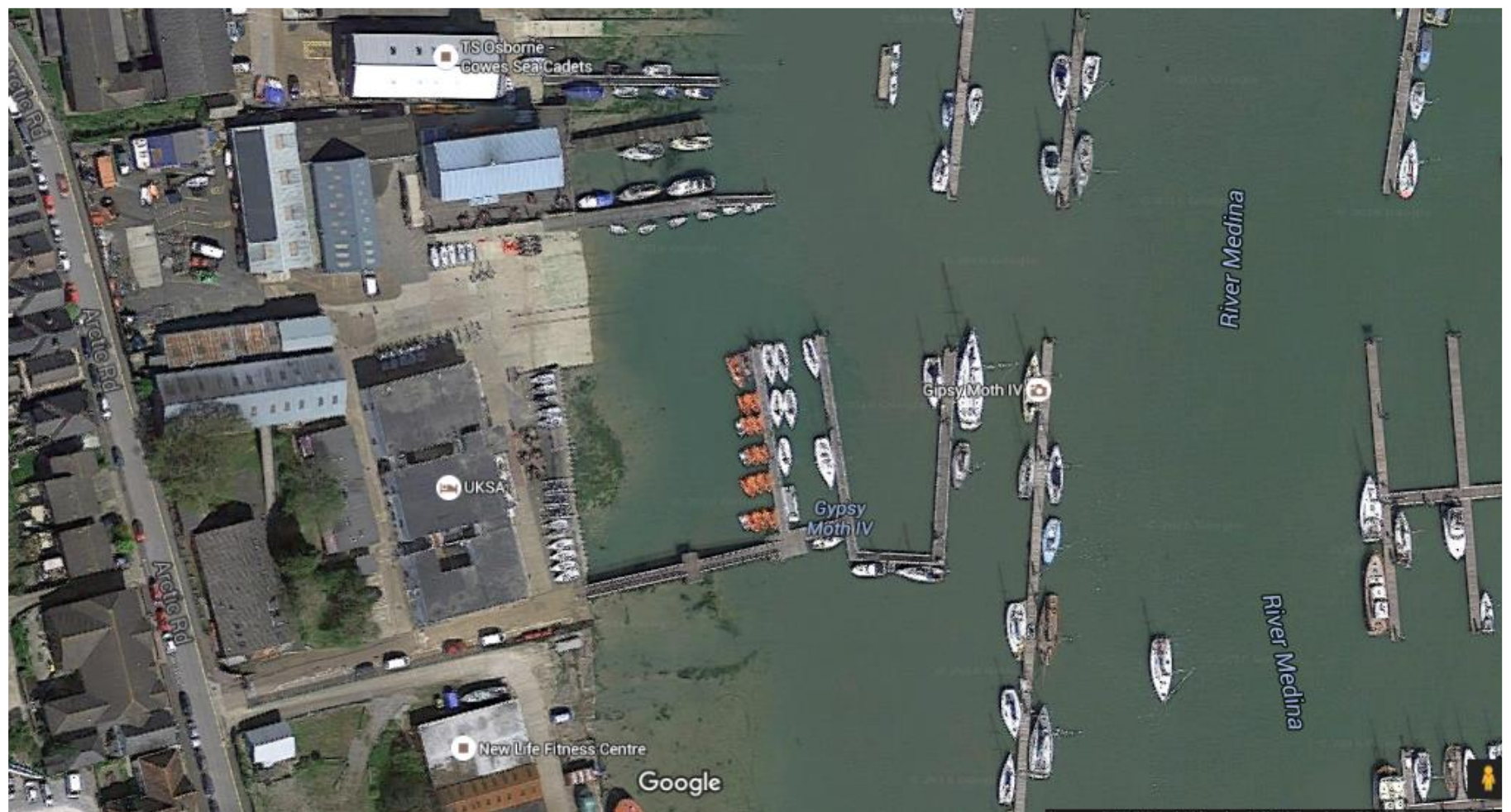
Why are we going?
