Godalming Junior School Comeback Curriculum



- Spending time using formative assessment and handover notes to get to know children.
- Identifying gaps in learning
- Timetable adjustments to ensure all children's needs are met
- Class teacher led interventions
- Changes to curriculum
- Stand alone Spelling and SPaG sessions to complement English curriculum







- Continues to be a GLP wide focus
- School Improvement Plan priority
- Focussing on the power of talk around pieces of writing
- Also focusing on writing styles of authors that the children attempt to replicate through the imitate, innovate and invent model
- Requires support from parents through reading and being questioned on their reading
- Data shows, nationally, children's READING has a direct correlation to the quality of children's WRITING








- ≥1st year of being in the Upper School


Homework and Reading Records

- ➤ Homework will be given out on a Monday and be returned on a Friday.
- ➤ Children will be expected to complete **up to** 40 minutes per piece of Maths and English homework every week. They will also be given a half termly project which should take approximately 90 minutes to complete overall. The English and half termly project will be uploaded onto Google Classroom. Maths will mainly be from our maths homework books and TT Rockstars.
- Ideally we would like children to read every night and for adults to make a note of this in their reading record. We would also like children to keep a running record of the titles of the books that they are reading, which can be found at the front of their reading records.
- ➤ Children should aim to get at least 1 signature/initial in their reading record each week which will be checked every Thursday.



Helping with Reading at Home

- What has happened in the story so far?
- Who are the main characters?
- Who left the gate open?
- Why was that?
- Why do you think Sam chose to walk instead of ride his bike?
- Why do you think Sarah hid behind the sofa?
- What tells us that she may have been cross?
- > Is this similar to another story you have read? How?


Reading Passports

- Termly challenge to read up to 8 books from the passport
- This is in addition to the books they are regularly reading
- Prizes given at the end of each term for those achieving Bronze (up to 4),
 Silver (up to 6) or Gold (all 8)
- Book reviews also required within the challenge- see Google Classroom
- Display outside 5CJ with the book spines on them and in both classrooms
- Passports compliment the curriculum e.g. some non-fiction books linked to topics
- Over the course of the year there are an equal number of non-fiction, fiction, female and male authors, stories from different cultures, classic and contemporary
- Children are also encouraged to recommend books to each other and Mr Samson!

Helping with Maths at Home

- > Play games such as monopoly and card games



ASSESSMENT AND TARGETS


- We assess the children on a daily basis to ensure that work is tailored to effectively challenge them and to ascertain where gaps may be.
