Anti Bullying @ GJS 2022



- The GJS Anti Bullying Survey took place during the national Anti Bullying week in November 2022
- All classes and children took part in the survey
- The survey was provided by the 'Anti Bullying Alliance'.
- The GJS Anti Bullying Stars were presented to the school, were presented with their badges and helped the whole school assembly on the theme of this years' ABW 'Reach Out'
- The AB Stars reviewed the GJS Anti Bullying Charter, the child friendly version of our Anti Bullying Policy and created our first, school wide, Who To Talk To If I Feel Unsafe posters

Survey Outcomes



- Each class that took part equates to approximately 12% of responses
- 88% of responses stated they disagreed or strongly disagreed that bullying was a problem at GJS - 1 class lower than last year
- 100% agreed or strongly agreed that GJS was a safe place same as last year
- 100% agreed or strongly agree that bullying is taken seriously at GJS same as last year
- 48% stated having never seen any bullying incidents higher than last year with 48% stating it only took place 'sometimes' (1-2 times a month). There were no responses to bullying incidents taking place 'regularly' (1-2 times a week) or 'Every Day'
- 100% of responses stated bullying is most likely to take place 'At Lunch Times' same as last year*
- 100% of responses all stated they felt they could talk to an adult about bullying and bullying incidents - same as last year

What could the school do more to prevent bullying?



- More staff on duty at break and lunch times
- More CCTV cameras in places
- Pod open more often
- More Anti Bullying Stars
- Friendship Stop
- Greater awareness for children and parents of what bullying is and what it isn't
- More assemblies on anti bullying
- To encourage children to inform adults if there are any cases







Next Steps



- Whole School Anti Bullying Charter reviewed, shared in assembly and on display throughout the school
- Staff to circulate more around the play grounds and focus on areas highlighted in the AB survey
- Investigate possibility of increasing the CCTV in school consulting with the AB Stars on this
- Children to go straight to office at lunchtime with any injury
- Staff to be encouraged to hold additional Circle Times if there is a need
- Anti Bullying Assembly each term including updates from AB Stars
- AB Award given out in Celebration Assemblies to classes identified as 'Good Players' each term
- Publish posters on 'Reach out' and encourage all children to SPEAK UP on bullying
- Standing AB Star agenda item in both staff and LSA meetings to help inform evidence to award AB Break time Star Award to the best class each term
