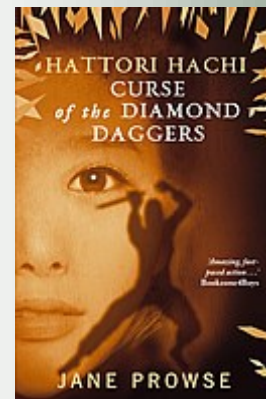
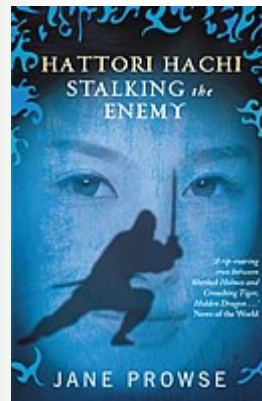
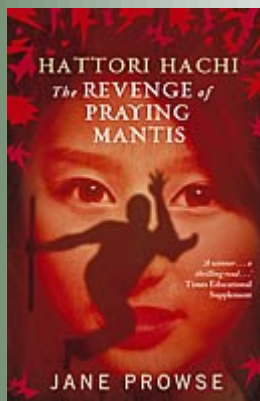
Clandon Park is a historic place to take a relaxing stroll. You can take a walk, admire the antique furniture and generally relax. This time of year it is an awe-inspiring winter wonderland. It was built in 1720 by the Onslow family and was given to the National Trust in 1956 (to exhibit the lovely 18th century Furniture). A lot of the house is in the same condition and has been kept as it was in 1956 even after the fire that happened there. Some of the furniture is original 18th century Dutch. LEMON DRIZZLE CAKE

Cake

- 6oz (175g) baking spread especially for cakes or soft butter
 - 6oz (175g) caster sugar
 - 7oz (200g) self-raising flour
 - 1 level teaspoon baking powder
 - 3 eggs
 - 3 tablespoons milk
1. Grease the 12 hole loose silicon bottomed bun tins. Measure all the ingredients into a large bowl and beat well for about 2 minutes until well blended. Spoon the mixture into the bun tins, dividing evenly between the 12 portions.
 2. Bake in preheated oven 180C/160Fan/Gas 4 for about 20 minutes until risen, golden and shrinking away from the side of the tin.
 3. Mix together the lemon juice and sugar to give a runny consistency. Spread out evenly over the warm cakes and leave to set. Once cold loosen the edges of the cakes and push up the base firmly to lift out

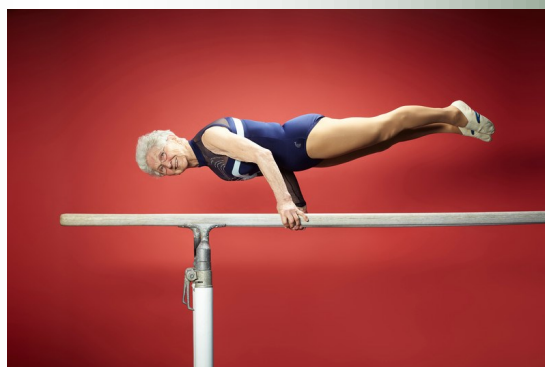
1. READ THIS NEWSPAPER

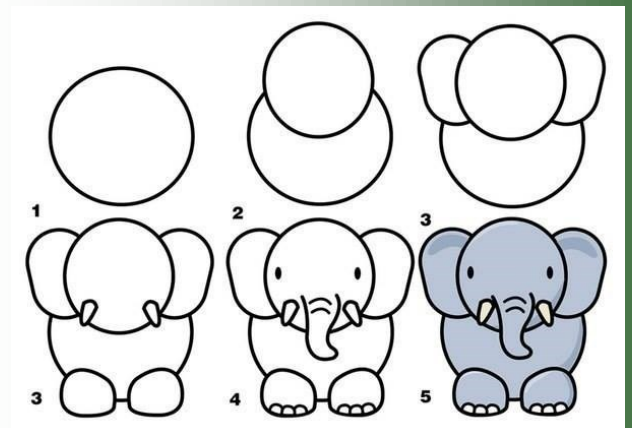
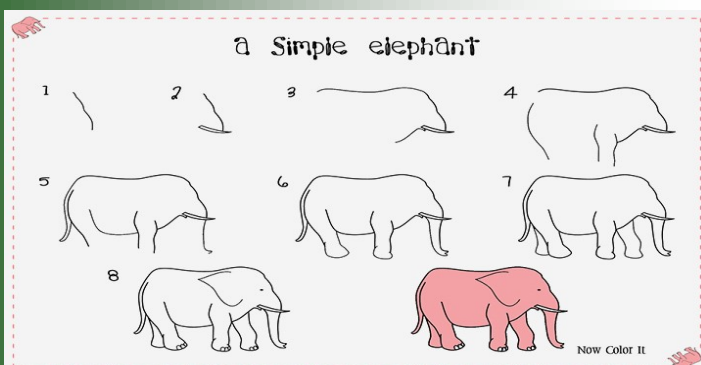
ELEPHANTS
