PE Kit

There is an alarming number of children each week who do not have their PE kits in school on the day it is needed. PE is a statutory subject and is timetabled at the same time each week in ALL year groups and the expectation is that their kit is in school on these days. There are additional times throughout the year when their kit is also needed e.g. cricket coaching, clubs, trials for events. Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school all week rather than just the days they have their PE session. There may be occasions when the children will need their kits on different days as we enter the summer term. The profile of children and PE and access to physical activity has very high media coverage and we want to make sure ALL children are able to access the curriculum and participate in at least 2 hours of PE every week. This can only happen if the children have the correct kit in school to achieve this. Most children bring their kit in on Monday and then take it home Friday. This covers all eventualities of PE related activities throughout the week.

Please be aware that penalty notices can be issued for unauthorised leave of absence for five days or more.
