




Welcome Back Year 6





Highlights

- The latest government expectations are that **from** 1st June schools will begin opening.
- This will begin with Year 6.
- Classes will be halved with groups of up to 15 this is dependent on whether it is safe for them to attend and parents taking up the offer and will be for the first 2 weeks.
- We MAY consider the return of other year groups if WE feel it is safe to do so.





Categories

- Based on the latest information and guidance, our decision to open has been based on 4 key areas
 - Staff safety
 - Children's safety
 - Changes to routine
 - Changes to the school site





The following slides will give a clearer view of what a return for Year 6 will look like.







Why are we coming back part-time?

- Due to the staffing and limited space we felt this was the safest way to begin to reopen.
- Lots of changes needed to be done to the site and we need to check they
 work before having more children on the school site.
- We also knew it had been a long time that the you had been off for and needed integrating back gradually.
- Many of us have been worried and anxious about coming back and we need to be sure we are taking the right steps.



What will the we wear?

You will wear your **summer** uniform. This could include your PE t-shirt.





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What will we be allowed to bring to school?

- A reading book this will be from home and will HAVE TO STAY IN SCHOOL.
- Lunch Box If you are not able to have lunch at home and are brining in a lunch from home you will bring it in to school to be kept in the trolley in the horsa hut on arrival.
- Stationery You will need to bring in stationery such as pencil, pen, ruler, rubber, glue stick, <u>pink</u> <u>polishing pen</u>, white board pen and scissors. However, this is not to be taken home as it must stay in school. Others should not use or borrow your stationery.
- A mobile phone Optional. This is for those who walk to school alone and is brought in at your own risk. The phone will be kept with you in your trays as you will not be able to hand them in to the office like you would do normally.
- Medication If you have any medication, this will also have to stay with you in your trays and stay in school
- **Personal Toy** Such as a Rubik's cube, this should **only** be handled by yourself and not others. As there is no equipment you can use at break, this may be a good thing to play with

What will you NOT be allowed to bring to school?

- A PE kit this will not be required
- Other items



You will not need to access your locker at all during your time in school. The lockers will become an OOB area (Out Of Bounds)



What lessons will you have?



- Lessons initially be Maths and English only with some transition work too.
- After a couple of weeks there will more lessons.
 Your teacher will tell you more about these.
- Following the guidance, lessons will be outside where possible and purposeful.



LUNCHBOX

Will there be a break time?

- There will be a break time and you will only be allowed on one playground each day e.g. 6JP Front Monday, 6JP Back Tuesday.
- There will be no ball games or use of the trim trail

What happens at lunchtime?

- Initially, at 11.30am those who are not staying for lunch will leave school from the Hallam Road gate to meet a parent or go straight home.
- If anyone in the morning group **ARE** staying for lunch you will go to the back playground to either get your packed lunch or your school lunch and eat it outside where possible. There will be **20 minutes** to have lunch then leave the school through the Hallam Road gate.
- If anyone in the afternoon group are coming into school for lunch, you will do this from 12.00pm onwards. Again, you would collect their school lunch and sit outside or unpack the packed lunch you have brought with you to eat on the back playground. Again, you will have 20 minutes to each your lunch before going into class for a 12.30 start.
- During this time the school 'Clean Team' will be in classes cleaning desks, chairs and surfaces ready for the afternoon group.





When do you wash your hands?

- There will be points throughout the day when you will be expected to wash hands either using the sink soap or hand sanitiser.
- As soon as you enter your class.
- When you get in from break.
- Before you go home/go for lunch.
- When you have been to the toilet you will be required to wash your hands as you normally would.



Will everyone be back?



- Though we want everyone to come back to school, parents may decide not to send their children back at the moment.
- Each parent has the right to do that and your attendance will not be effected.
- Some children may not be able to come back because either they or someone in their household is especially vulnerable





Are there any different rules?

- There will be a set of new rules which your teacher will share with you on day one.
- You must also follow the signs around the school regarding which gates to use, which rooms are for certain groups only, which places are out of bounds and which direction to go in so 'Stay Alert'.



New School Rules



Do...

- Wash your hands every time you come back into class, cough, before you eat, and once you've been to the toilet.
- Use the classroom sink to wash your hands when you come in.
- Use the toilet at the right times.
- Use your own stationery.
- Keep mobile phone in your tray
 it is your responsibility.
- Leave pens and pencil cases in your trays when you go home.
- Place you coat/jumper on the back of your chair.
- Use the correct doors to enter and exit building.



- Mix with children or adults from another group.
- Go to other rooms or the office.
- Use lockers.
- Touch or share any equipment.
- Use your mobile phone in school.
- Use climbing frame or balls when outside.
- Bring any extra things to school including a bag or PE kit.













Will you be back full time?

- The plan is after 2 weeks and after our arrangements have worked well, you have adjusted to being back and it is safe to do so, we HOPE to be back for 4 full days. This will be all day Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday.
- IF this happens... 6RH will be split between 6RH and 3CM the room next door but with 6RH furniture and 6JP will be split between 6JP and 5CH as above.
- You will continue to have the adults you have had.
- There will be no contact between the classes though and you must continue to follow our new rules and follow the measure we have in place.
- You will also be having lunch at school like you did before we closed, but again, outside where possible.



Will other classes come back?



- We HOPE that Year 5, 4 and 3 can have **some** time in school following Year 6.
- You will not mix with them however and they will arrive, have break and lunch and leave at the end of the day at different times.
- This will **ONLY** happen if **we** consider the school is safe to welcome them back.



Will the school close again?



- IF there is a child who develops symptoms in school, they will be sent home immediately to be tested.
- During this time, the group will be at home for 2 days.
- If the test comes back positive, the group will be selfisolating for 14 days from that day. You would also need to be tested.



Do you need to wear a mask or gloves?



The guidance for schools state you do not need to wear a mask or gloves.



Will the school be cleaned?



- The classes will be cleaned initially at lunchtimes and after school.
- Other places the Year 6 children go will be cleaned also e.g. Dining Room.
- We have contract cleaners who will clean the classes after school too.



Can you bring in hand sanitiser?



As you know, each class has a hand sanitiser dispenser and therefore you will not need to bring in any of your own.



Is there a risk assessment?
