Our VALUE in focus is: FRIENDSHIP

As we enter a new term, our attention turns to the new 'in focus' value, *friendship*. Once again, this will be the theme of weekly assemblies, it will inform our PSHE lessons and staff will be on high-alert looking for worthy contenders of our Values Champion Award. We focus on this value at this time of year as children have settled into their new classes and are encouraged to be more aware of what they do and say to others, and ensure they are always trying to be the best *friend* possible—not easy. A new feature in our weekly newsletter includes the thoughts of the children on the 'in-focus' value and *what it means to them*. Last week, Isabel in Year 3 had her interpretation shared in the newsletter. This week, Henry in Year 6 shares his definition of *friendship*. These will be found towards the banner at the top of the newsletter each week. We continue to urge *Home Talks* to take place, when adults spend time with their children, either on car journeys, at meal-times, at bed-times or on walks; to discuss the importance of *friendship*, what it means to you, what you value in the friends you have and whether any friendships have been tested.

10R—Hero Week

Monday will see us launch our first 10Richment Week of 2026, and this also coincides with Martin Luther King Jnr Day, recognised in the USA as a federal holiday. This falls on the third Monday each January (as close to his birthday on the 15th as possible) to honour the life and legacy of the civil rights leader. The federal holiday serves as a national day of service and reflection on racial equality; a global challenge that continues to this day. The children will learn more about his life during Monday's assembly, and throughout the week the children will 'dive-deeper' into the term 'hero'—what the term means to them, how they would define the term hero, consider modern day heroes, heroes from the past, fictional heroes and the term 'national treasure'. Parents and carers are invited to take part in a short fun and optional activity to share YOUR views on the term 'national treasure' and what this may mean to you. 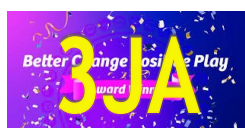

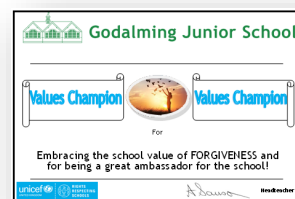
