Homework and Reading Records

>Children will be expected to complete **up to** 40 minutes per piece of Maths and English homework every week. They will also be given a half termly project which should take approximately 90 minutes to complete overall.

≻The English and half termly project will be uploaded onto Google Classroom. Maths will mainly be from our maths homework books and TT Rockstars.

 \geq We would like children to read as often as possible and for <u>adults</u> to make a note of this in their reading record.

Reading Passports

- Termly challenge to read up to 8 books from the passport and is optional
- Prizes given at the end of each term for those achieving Bronze (up to 4), Silver (up to 6) or Gold (all 8)
- Book reviews also required within the challenge
- Over the course of the year there is a good variety of non-fiction, fiction, female and male authors, stories from different cultures, classic and contemporary

Helping with Maths at Home

- \succ Please practise number bonds and times tables.
- Use fun websites to encourage children
- Encourage children to play on TT Rockstars as often as possible
- > Let them help you cook (weighing out ingredients, measuring volume etc)
- \succ Let your child use money and work out change. Many children don't ever see coins.
- \succ Help them to be aware of the time by reading clocks.
- Play games such as monopoly and card games

Safeguarding and Appointments

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INCLUSION



If you think your child needs additional support for their learning, please speak to their teacher. Your class teacher may then involve Mrs Nancy Kirby, who is our new Home-School Link Worker (and works Mon & Tues).

- As part of the school's Sports Premium funding strategy, last year we created a 'PE Assistant' role at GJS. This led to 90% of GJS children either representing their house or school last year.
- Bill Bingham, from Waverley 365, runs trials, clubs, supports house events and sessions on Friday afternoons
- The role is overseen by the HT Mr Samson and PE leader Mr MacIver
- He also runs 'Activ8' sessions with groups of children from each year, each term
- These sessions are designed to increase coordination, endurance, develop motor skills, wellbeing and general participation within physical activities
- These sessions are optional and run termly
- IF you do not want your child to be a part of these sessions then please let your teacher know
- ALSO if you feel your child would benefit from these sessions then please inform your teacher
