School Council—High 5 Priorities

Mr Samson met with our newly formed School Council for the first time recently and after much sharing, discussion and voting, the children decided on the following areas to prioritise this coming year under our 'High 5' headings:

Mr Samson has also met with our newly appointed AB Stars for the coming year. The children talked through their role and their first task was to review the AB Star Break Time Charter. This is used to remind children HOW to play with kindness, respect and inclusion during break and lunch times. They were also made aware of how they will support classmates and Mr Samson during Anti Bullying Week next month. This involves helping Mr Samson lead an assembly, launch the AB poster competition and support teachers in creating their class '5 finger check' identifying those to go to if they ever feel unsafe.

School Surveys
We have recently updated our survey section of the school website and you are able to see the latest findings from the surveys here. These include our staff wellbeing survey, our anti-bullying survey, our latest pupil survey findings and the link for parents to access the Ofsted Parent View site, or click on the Ofsted logo \(\bigsim \). We are expecting to be inspected later this academic year by Ofsted using their updated 'report card' framework following their last visit 4 years ago and part of their process is to analyse any Parent View data on GJS. We therefore would like parents to find time to access Parent View over the coming weeks. We will also have work stations set up in the school hall during our first round of Parent-Teacher Meetings in November to access Parent View.



Year 5 Tilford Mosque Visit
On Tuesday, Year 5 Visited Mubarak Mosque in Tilford, to support their learning about the Islamic faith. We were intrigued to learn that the Mosque is the international headquarters of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, and the leader of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community actually lives on site and hosts the daily prayers. The members of the Mosque were impressed with the children's existing knowledge and their curiosity when asking questions to deepen their understanding. Marcell commented "I really liked visiting the Mosque as there were good designs on the walls and ceilings. I liked learning about how Muslims adapt the timings of their 5 daily prayers to fit around work and travel."
