Overview of the School

Nature of Support

- a) Specialist Sports CPD provided by Winchester University £2,000
- b) Professional PE CPD from PE specialist/Headteacher Staff Meeting time
- Play Leader Mentor training, purchasing equipment, training of pupils and delivery of activities -£1,700
- d) Release of PE co-ordinator to organise and take part in inter-schools events £2,500
- e) To develop the outdoor learning space to maximize outdoor pursuits opportunities £26,000
- f) PE Subject Leader and staff to complete qualification in multi sports £1,500
- g) School to fund SSCO provision to enable inter school competition £1,500
- h) Funding support for 'disengaged children' club provision £2,500
- i) Funding of visitor speakers to run workshops for children/parents e.g. nutritionist £2,000
- j) Up-leveling of Sports equipment including gymnastic mats and inclusive sports eq, £2,000
- k) Running track installed to promote '1k a day' initiative £2,500

Impact of SPG spending

Expected impact of spending for the year 2018-19 shows

- a) Teaching profile of 100% good+ teaching staff appraisal cycle to include formal PE observation
- b) Teachers to be up-skilled in the teaching of PE in a variety of disciplines e.g. gymnastics and dance.
- c) ALL children engaged in a more active capacity at break and lunch times due to the high quality and large multi-purpose climbing frame. Behaviour incidences have fallen with more children engaged on a positive play experience.
- d) Play leaders create organised active activities at lunchtime. The children who normally do not participate in football time and basketball time are encouraged and play these activities. Awards are given out in celebration to promote participation.
- e) 50%+ of children to represent the school by the end of the year in inter and intra-school events
- f) Greater participation and opportunity for children to represent house and school. This includes GJS Premier League Football where participation was seen throughout the school including girls; cricket an all-day event with support from Farncombe Wonderers CC open to all children; and Sports Day where events accommodate multiple sports participation for all children.
- g) Disengaged pupils signposted to and provision facilitated to access extra-curricular activity at a lunchtime club. Sports included curling, table tennis, golf and skipping. All children were engaged in these activities and found enjoyment when doing so.
- h) Through our 10richment weeks, including 3x Healthy Weeks, 2x parent workshops (nutritionists), children have gained a greater awareness of how to maintain a healthy lifestyle through eating healthily and keeping active physically and mentally.

Review

Next Year

- a) Due to large spend on multi-purpose climbing frame, 1k track to be setup next year.
- b) To implement a larger inter-house series of tournaments to increase participation to 75% include: cross country, rounders, curling and basketball.

c) Participate in more inter-school clubs - netball and rounders.d) Start up a running club.
