The School Council also carried out some 'care in the community' by litter picking in Farncombe on Tuesday and Godalming yesterday.

Year 5 River Trip

On Wednesday afternoon, Year 5 had a great trip walking along the River Wey. As part of our Rivers and Oceans geography unit, the children enjoyed identifying river features and reflecting on the human impact on the river. They also predicted what the river and its surroundings might look like in 100 years' time - ask your child what they thought! The pupils also had the chance to put into practice some of the art skills that they have been learning - in particular drawing using the horizon and working on perspective in sketching. All in all, it was a very enjoyable and interesting local experience.

Year 5 Space Exhibition

This morning, Year 5 and their parents 'blasted off' into space in order to explore the new planets that have been discovered in our solar system. Over the last couple of weeks, the children have worked extremely hard to design their own planets based on the knowledge they have gained about Space this term. They thought about what planets look like, the life that was found there and how long the days, weeks and months are, based on its size and position. The children all presented their work beautifully to their audience and were keen to show off their designs.
