


Ways to help at home

- Keep encouraging your child to read at home. Try
 and read with them as much as possible. We
 expect diaries to be signed by parents/carers
 (even if children are reading independently).
- Encourage your child to write as much as possible at home (diary, create comic strip, emailing relatives, writing stories, creating lists).
- Times tables practice should be maintained it is important they have quick recall as it is an important life skill.
- Life skill maths should be practiced as often as possible - using money, telling the time etc.



Expectations

- Your child is now entering Upper Key Stage 2 and therefore expectations also rise.
- The children are expected to uphold the values and standards of the school. Being a role model to the younger years. They will be buddies next year...
- Children are expected to be more independent; managing their own resources, toileting in break times and take more responsibility for their learning.



Equipment

- Children are expected to have their own equipment
- We recommend naming items to avoid items being misplaced.

Maths - Four operations, Fractions, Decimals and percentages#


Foundation - Rivers and Oceans, Space, Landscapes

Foundation - Life cycle of animals, Human development, Local history, Sewing.




Trips

- · UKSA Payment Plan for Year 6


PTA will often support us to fund visitors to come to the school, we are in the process of organizing this and will update in due course.







- Homework will start after the October half term
- We will still be monitoring your child's reading at home during this first half term and would strongly encourage them to be doing Times Table Rock Stars daily
- Homework will be posted on Google Classroom.
- Children will have the appropriate logins given to them we recommend sticking them into their reading diaries for safekeeping.
- We expect the children to be reading daily, and recommend a minimum of 4 reads a week. Diaries should be signed by an adult weekly. Children should hand in to teachers on a Monday morning in registration.



Assessment

- · Continuous assessment procedures in the school informs all our teaching and learning.
- Children are assessed after every Big Write (approximately 3 per term).
- Two formal assessments during the academic year for Reading, SPAG and Maths (dates tbc).
- Importance of attendance

If you engage with the school, your child attends school regularly (95%) AND is here for 4 years, they will be successful here!






Writing targets

- This year, each child will be given an individual writing target for each half term.
- Your child will have this written at the back of their reading record.
- When your child is completing any homework or writing at home, please encourage them to keep their target in mind to form good habits.



Year 5

- Leadership opportunities: Children can write a speech to apply for a position on the school council or to be an anti-bullying star.
- Swimming Year 5 Autumn 2 occurs during our Tuesday PE afternoon. We walk children to Godalming Leisure Centre for their lessons. Groups will be decided by the swimming instructors only. Fees (£21.50) will be sent out later this week.
- For those children that need a 'refresher', this will happen in Summer 2.



E-Safety

What we do in school:

- · Each year group starts computing with an e-safety unit.
- We participate in 'Safer Internet Day' every February, with a different focus each year.
- Each class creates an e-safety charter.
- Regular chats about being safe online during circle time.
- We encourage open communication with children so they speak up without judgement.
- Adults are alerted if children search content that is blocked by our monitoring system (Surf Protect).
- There is an e-safety policy in place which covers online safety.
- Mental health support is given to those that need support or to build self confidence.

How you can help:

- Ensure you have sufficient systems in place. If you are unsure, please reach out to your class teacher of HSLW (Mrs Crook).
- Agree family rules around technology
- Encourage open communication without judgement.
- Ensure children are supervised whilst using technology (particularly phones).
- Be a good role model; consider what you are doing with technology.
- Consider if you child NEEDS a mobile phone. If so, does it NEED to be a smartphone?
- We are a Smart phone free school.


