Over the past two weeks, all Year 6 children have received training in CPR, what to do in a case of anaphylaxis and how to use a defibrillator. We were very proud of the maturity that our Year 6 pupils showed in each session and they asked valuable questions. A big thank you to our wonderful PTA for funding such an important skill!

Year 6 Workshops

Year 6 had a tremendous time this week at the SATRO workshop where they learnt all about how they can be more energy efficient at home. They learnt about different things such as turning lights off, setting washing machines to a lower power and using solar panels. After their discussion, the children got the op-portunity to explore and make different electrical circuits which entailed lighting up bulbs, spinning fans and using a buzzer. In addition, we've also had our Empathy Plus Migration workshop, kindly taught by the Red Cross Charity. It gave children a real idea of what others go through in their day-to-day lives and how they might feel in these terrible situations. The children reflected on how they could treat and support others. We're really proud as they came up with some thoughtful and well thought out responses. <u>Attendance</u>

You may be aware that school attendance is a hot topic nationally as schools, particularly secondary schools, struggle to get their attendance figures returning to 'pre COVID' levels. As a result, the DfE and the local authority are putting new systems, processes and deterrents in place in the hope that children's attendance improves and there is a reduction in their 'broken weeks' when odd days are taken. GJS has enjoyed fantastic attendance figures for a number of years and we really appreciate the support from par-ents in fully investing in the education of their children so that attendance figures are higher than local, similar and national averages. You will be receiving a letter shortly outlining the DfE's position and the issuing of penalty notices from September 2024.
