

International Week
This week, GJS pupils grabbed their passports and boarded numerous 'flights' to travel around Asia to celebrate International Week. The children took part in a range of activities centred around the country they were visiting. In Nepal, they learned about the Himalayas and made mountain picture collages, while in Bangladesh, they learned the popular sport of Kabbadi. When visiting the UAE, pupils competed to build the tallest tower and in India, they made their own Rangoli art. A trip to Vietnam saw the children making spring rolls and finally, they learned how to centre themselves with Tai-Chi when travelling to Pan-Asia, specifically in China. Both staff and children had a fantastic week sharing their experiences of different cultures with each other and I think many people mirror Toby's (3AR) thoughts about the week: "I've loved it so much I am already excited about next year! Where are we heading then?"

Year 6 would like to express their heartfelt thanks to Mr Atkins who visited this afternoon to provide first aid training. School Access 2025-26

Following a recent safeguarding review of the school site, the school welfare team has taken the decision to disable the Meadrow school gate at the end of the school day from September. This will only be used next year in the case of emergencies. At the beginning and end of each day both the Marshall Road and Hallam Road gate will continue to be used and there will be a staff presence at the end of each day, like there has been at the beginning of the day, at the Marshall Road gate as this is where most children leave the school site independently. We are informing parents now so appropriate measures and changes can be arranged before Thursday 4th September, the

Walking Home Policy Change 2025-26

We will also be changing our Walking Home Policy from September 2025, which will see ONLY those in the upper school leave the school at the end of the day independently. The only children who will be able to leave the school site at the end of the day in the lower school are those with older siblings in the upper phase of the school, who they leave with each day. Once again, we are informing parents now so any arrangements can be made as early as possible in preparation for September. We thank you for your understanding that making these changes will make routines and practices at G.S. even safer for the children here. routines and practices at GJS even safer for the children here.

Attendance We would like to remind parents that where a child is taken out of school for 10 sessions or more and the 'leave of absence' is without the authority of the Headteacher, each parent is liable to receive a penalty notice for each parent is liable to receive and the liable to receive a penalty notice for eac absent. If a parent/carer has not incurred a penalty notice relating to the relevant child/children since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
