WALKING HOME POLICY

This policy represents the agreed principles for children walking home from school. This policy has been agreed by staff and governors within the school. Though not statutory, we recognise that there are a number of children who will walk to and from school due to the proximity of the school and therefore the need to have this policy in place and reviewed as required. Parents signing the Home School Agreement agree to uphold all the school policies during their time at Godalming Junior School. At GJS we acknowledge that there are limited powers and influence the school has when referring to children walking *to* school as opposed to walking home *from* school

Introduction:

The purpose of the policy is:

- To raise awareness and provide a clear procedure for children walking home from school

- To inform parents of their roles and responsibilities when giving authorisation for their child/ren to walk home from school

- To inform the parents of the schools role and responsibility

Parents of children who wish them to walk home unescorted by an adult, at the end of the school day must adhere to the following guidelines:

- Parents must have registered with the school that they are prepared for their child/ren to walk directly home from school at the end of the day
- Parents must be aware that their child will be dismissed from the school playground and will need to make their own way to the school gates, which will not be manned by a member of staff
- It is advised that the children walking home should be in the upper school
- It is the parent's responsibility to have an 'emergency plan' in place with their child /ren in case there is no adult at the pick-up point at the collection time. We advise that this 'emergency plan' is to walk back to the school office where help will be available
- It is the parent's responsibility to check the route that their children may walk home in order that they make an assessment of the appropriateness of the journey e.g. the crossing of fast roads and walking through secluded areas is discouraged. A single route must be agreed
- Parents must be certain that their child/ren have an awareness and understanding of the 'Green Cross Code' and 'Stranger Danger'. It is a parent's responsibility to ensure they are sufficiently happy that their child is capable of undertaking the proposed journey safely
- During winter months and/or inclement weather, children need to be dressed appropriately
- Children should preferably walk in a group and not alone
- Children should know their home phone number (plus an emergency contact)
- Year 6 children may have a mobile phone that is kept in the school and is approved by the HT



- It is recommended that there is someone at home to meet the child on arrival
- It is advised that the journey should not be longer than a 30 minute walk
- Parents must sign the Walking Home Confirmation Form before the arrangement for the child/ren walking home has been initiated, see appendix A
- Parents are responsible for the well-being of their child/ren once the child/ren are not on the school site, either travelling to or from the school site if the WHCF has been signed and returned to school. School will retain the original with a copy being sent home
- Conduct between pupils travelling to and from school could be in violation of the school Behaviour Policy if the 'common denominator' regarding the relationship is school itself
