THE GJS SAFEGUARDING/HEALTHY SCHOOLS CURRICULUM - SUMMER

Year 3

- PSHE: Rail / road / water safety covered over 2 lessons.
- DT (cooking): Hygiene and safety in the kitchen (theory) covered in class before the (practical) application of the principles in the school kitchen.
- DT (sewing): we cover how to keep safe with a needle at the beginning of each lesson.

Year 4

- PSHE lessons on mental health, balanced lifestyle, first aid, risk assessments and hazard prevention.
- Lessons (leading up to Sayers Croft) about healthy food choices, being safe in the sun, drinking plenty of fluids, the benefits of sleep and exercise, the importance of personal hygiene and keeping clean, dealing with anxiety and the importance of talking to others if you have a worry or a problem.
