Writing TRANSFORMERS

As we near the end of the 2nd year of our Writing TRANSFORMER initiative, we are seeing efforts to eradicate the 'COViD tail' pay off. As you know, writing was the biggest casualty following COViD en-forced school closures 5 years ago, still reflected in national averages of key stage 2 leavers and the area improving by the smallest margins nationally each year. Congratulations to those who we recognised who have truly **TRANSFORMED** their writing and have made great progress this last term. The recipients can be found on the reverse of the newsletter

GJS Attendance Well done to ALL the classes who have maintained really high levels of attendance once again this year at GJS. As you know, attendance is really important to us and it has been great to see the level of persistent absences on the decline and the average attendance remain at exceptional levels. Well done to **5NM** who are the Attendance Winners this term with an average of **98.2%**. Thank you to all parents and carers who value regular attendance too and play a pivotal role in enabling attendance at GJS to be so strong!

AB Stars Break-Time Champion Award

Following the analysis of our behaviour data from CPOMs, it was great to see that Negative Behaviour Incidents and Friendship Incidents continue to be low and another strength at GJS, averaging fewer than 1 incidents and Friendship incidents continue to be tow and another strength at 035, averaging lewer than 1 incident a day across the school. There are so many reasons why incidents are so low here, ranging from our restorative systems, high levels of vigilance at all time, the consistently modelled behaviours of the adults the children come into contact with, our calm, purposeful and predictable culture and the wonderful level of pastoral care and sense of nurture that is reinforced in most homes. The class with the fewest incidents this term were 4JS and should be rightly proud to receive and display the AP Star traphy for the payt term. and display the AB Star trophy for the next term! We have no doubt they will set the tone in September as new children arrive!

<u>Reading Passports</u> It is great that 'reading for pleasure' is alive and kicking at GJS, which was clearly visible today during our final Celebration Assembly. Not only did we have a large number of children achieving GOLD by reading 8 books this term but we also had the largest number of 'Golden-Gold' recipients, **57** in total across the school, who have read 8 books **EVERY** term this year! With so many more distractions for children outside school, it is so reassuring that so many children are committing time to read as a way of relaxing , learning or informing their writing!

G-Fest' 2025

It was great to see sooooo many children put themselves forward and participate in our inaugural 'G-Fest' musical showcase (our revamped GJS Got Talent). The whole school was treated to a morning of dancing, singing and performing! It was most impressive to see our youngest at GJS take to the stage and perform in front of the whole school. Very brave. The audience, as you would expect, were super **respectful**, making it easier for our performers to do their thing! By the end, it was the house leaders who unanimously voted for the '**Unoriginals**' band as the overall winners and 'Star Performers'. We are sure they will go far. Look out for them headlining Glastonbury in the coming years!
