End of the Day Arrangements

From next half term, we will be trialing a new arrangement at the end of the day, to ensure children are coming out more efficiently to meet adults or leave independently. Children who are attending ANY club or KOOSA will remain behind in class, supervised by a member of staff, whilst the class teacher will bring the children out ready to be picked up or go home independently AT 3.05pm every day. Children attending clubs will then be handed over to the club adults by our members of staff straight after. We do ask that ANY changes of arrangements to end of day pick up arrangements are communicated to the school office, not the class teacher, as soon possible and that every effort is made to avoid changes beyond 2.00pm. We also ask that if the change affects the child attending a club that the club is notified as well. It is not the role of the school office staff to do this.

As we celebrate one value we begin to look ahead to next half term to the next 'in focus' value, FORGIVENESS. We will continue to immerse the children during school assemblies, circle times and PSHE lessons in our school values. We ALL continue to learn about, promote, reflect and consider our 'Desirable Dozen' values and what these values 'look like' in others, in our behaviours, in society and consider ways we can develop these values in ourselves. Our values help underpin so much of what we do at GJS we and we believe that during their time here, we want EVERY child to become more socially and emotionally aware and equipped to deal with challenges they face, in school and out. Our unique values education plays a significant part in achieving this and helps the behaviour and levels of attendance at GJS continue to be a true strength. to be a true strength.

All staff will continue to be on 'high alert' looking for children demonstrating *forgiveness* in lessons by forgiving themselves and moving on if they get something wrong. Importantly, on the playground if they fall out with a peer, a group or make a wrong choice; we want the children to be reflective enough and gracious enough to accept an apology or offer one. The more this can be further reinforced at home, the better. We encourage 'home talks' on our values and hope parents share examples when YOU have had to show *forgiveness*, how hard it can be to *forgive* and generally share YOUR views on the value and the importance of being *forgiving* in life!
