Nurture @ GJS

GJS is on a journey, in partnership with the charity Nurture UK, to become a 'Nurture' accredited school in order to ensure that the pastoral support that children receive at GJS is excellent. Part of this journey has been introducing all staff and children to the '6 Principles of Nurture' that underpin what we do and why we do it. Sadly, these principles are not the most child friendly so Mrs Farrow and Miss Coleman have launched a Nurture Competition that all children are free to participate in, should they want to. Children have been tasked with choosing a principle, thinking of an animal that matches it, designing that animal and then explaining why they chose that animal for that principle!
