Outstanding Attendance @ GJS

This week, we were contacted by the Department of Education who recognised our extremely high levels of attendance at the school. Out of nearly 2000 schools across the country, we are in the top percentile (top 10% nationally) of all schools thanks to our consistently high levels of attendance and consistently low (top 10% nationally) of all schools thanks to our **consistently** high levels of attendance and consistently low levels of persistent absences. This is a great achievement and one that all stakeholders should be proud of school leaders for putting such an emphasis and importance on attendance, parents for supporting the school and their children and knowing the importance of high attendance and of course the children WANTING to come to school so readily each day! The DfE went on to state that by highlighting our levels on their records, we may be contacted by other schools to help them raise their levels of attendance, which of course, we would be happy to do as the outward looking school we are!

Prospective Parent Tours
It was that time again this week when we were visited by Year 2 parents as the process begins for them to consider their junior school applications. This year we were visited by nearly 150 parents, from 10 different infant settings over the 4 tours. Thanks to the staff and the children themselves, the school looked extremely well cared for. The children who met the parents on Monday and Tuesday were amazing ambassadors for the school as they talked about what it is like to come to GJS, about their learning and what makes us different!

Our 'in focus' value for this half term is **FORGIVENESS**. We will continue to immerse the children during school assemblies, circle times and PSHE lessons in our school values. We ALL continue to learn about, promote, reflect and consider our 'Desirable Dozen' values and what these values 'look like' in others, in our behaviours, in society and consider ways we can develop these values in ourselves. Our values help underpin so much of what we do at GJS we and we believe that during their time here, we want EVERY child to become more socially and emotionally aware and equipped to deal with challenges they face, in school and out. Our unique values education plays a significant part in achieving this and helps the behaviour and levels of attendance at GJS continue to be a true strength.

All staff will continue to be on 'high alert' looking for children demonstrating *forgiveness* in lessons by

forgiving themselves and moving on if they get something wrong. Importantly, on the playground if they fall out with a peer, a group or make a wrong choice; we want the children to be reflective enough and gracious enough to accept an apology or offer one. The more this can be further reinforced at home, the better. We encourage 'home talks' on our values and hope parents share examples when YOU have had to show forgiveness, how hard it can be to forgive and generally share YOUR views on the value and the importance of being forgiving in life!

Free Reading App

'Libby' is a free reading app that lets you and your children borrow eBooks and audiobooks from your local library using a phone, tablet or computer. It's like having a library in your pocket - you can read or listen anywhere, anytime! To get started, all you need is your library card number and your PIN, which can be given to you by library staff.
