Impact of SPG spending April 2020 - April 2021
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Equipment - fit for use - to support teaching profile of 100% good+ teaching. New pop up goals and additional netball and basketball posts has enabled more children to practice these sports at one time.</li> <li>b) Increase in children engaged in a more active capacity at break and lunch times due to play time equipment and staging area to promote outdoor play. Behaviour incidences have fallen with more children engaged on a positive play experience.</li> <li>c) Behaviour incidences have fallen with more children engaged on a positive play experience.</li> <li>d) Training of new play leaders create organised active activities at lunchtime. This is specifically aimed at children who do not normally participate in football and basketball. Awards are given out in celebration assembly to raise the profile of these activities.</li> <li>e) With new equipment to raising profile of PE, five inter-house sports tournaments were arranged to encourage sports participation within school. Of the school, 46% took part in the football, 45% in the basketball and 22% in the cross-country. N.B. National lockdown forced cancellation of remaining tournaments. Medals and trophies raised the profile of the events for good participation across the school.</li> <li>f) Disengaged pupils signposted to and provision facilitated to access extra-curricular activity at a lunchtime club. Sports included curling, table tennis, golf and skipping. All children were engaged in these activities and found enjoyment when doing so.</li> </ul>
