80th Anniversary of VE Day 1945–2025 'Letters of Peace' theme—Thursday 8th May

Well done to all the children who fully embraced the 80th Anniversary of Victory in Europe Day yesterday by writing letters, sharing family stories, holding discussions about the importance of *peace* and reflecting on life 80 years ago as World War Two came to an end. Mr Samson also shared entries from the school log books during our special VE Day assembly, reminding the children of the 15 evacuees who came to GJS, when school was closed for the day when war was declared and equally, the day the school closed to celebrate Victory Day in 1945. We held the next best thing... a red, white or/and blue mufti day! Mayor and Consort Rivers also visited the school to help plant our VE Day 'Peace Tree', kindly donated by Van Arnham Nursery, in our Peace Garden along with our Tolerance Values Champions!
