Last Friday Sarah Lyles from the local authority, visited us to 'quality assure' our maintained status as a Surrey Healthy School. During her visit she met with teachers, leaders and children to validate the wonder-ful work we do to keep the children safe, provide a broad, ambitious and purposeful curriculum and set a culture at GJS of Respect for ALL. There are so many highlights to share from her findings:

'The school plays a significant leading role in Godalming Learning Partnership'

'The school has recently been successful in their application to become a Locality Nurture Hub for the borough'

'Attendance at the school for this point in the academic year is extremely positive'

'Pupils spoke passionately and positively about the school, the staff and the curriculum. They spoke with pride about the ways in which the school is <u>unique</u> and supports pupil wellbeing including physical and mental health'

'Pupils spoke in depth and with significant understanding about emotional intelligence and inclusion' Sarah finally stated that 'The passion underpinning the sentiments expressed by each person I met was overwhelming' and hoped that GJS would engage in a Surrey Healthy Schools case study to share our purposeful and effective practice more widely by producing a short video.

You may be aware that school attendance is a hot topic nationally as schools, particularly secondary schools, struggle to get their attendance figures returning to 'pre COVID' levels. As a result, the DfE and the local authority are putting new systems, processes and deterrents in place in the hope that children's attendance improves and there is a reduction in their 'broken weeks' when odd days are taken. GJS has enjoyed fantastic attendance figures for a number of years and we really appreciate the support from par-ents in fully investing in the education of their children so that attendance figures are higher than local, similar and national averages. You will be receiving a letter shortly outlining the DfE's position and the issuing of penalty notices from September 2024. All schools are being advised to inform parents of the DfE position during the last few weeks of term to avoid any ambiguity during the next academic year.
